

Information for patients, relatives and carers



The doctor wants you to have an ECG



An ECG looks at your heart beat and records it



This is an ECG machine



ECGs do not cause any pain or discomfort



The nurse will do the ECG




You will lay on your bed for the ECG



You will take off your top clothing



The nurse will apply some small square stickers to your chest



The ECG machine has 10 leads with clips at the ends of them




The nurse will clip these leads to the stickers on your chest



You need to lay still



And keep quiet whilst the machine records your heart beat



The machine will print a picture of your heart beat



The nurse will give this to the doctor



The nurse will then remove the leads and stickers
You will put your top back on



The doctor will talk to you about the results
