Introduction

This leaflet has been produced to provide you with information about the Breast Care Specialist Nursing Service. If you have any questions or wish to speak with us directly, please do not hesitate to contact us.

Who are the breast care specialist nurses?

The breast clinical nurse specialists (CNS) are nurses who specialist in breast cancer. We work as part of the multi-disciplinary team, alongside other healthcare professionals.

We offer specialised support and information to you, your family and carers throughout your cancer treatment and follow up care. We will also help you to move forward after cancer treatment.

We aim to offer a bespoke service for our patients and their carer(s). We have an open access ethos and we encourage you to contact us if you need support.

How can the specialist nurses help you?

We will:

- Provide you with information, emotional support and advice about your diagnosis and treatment.
- Provide you with a full explanation about the aims of treatment, the benefits, possible side effects and possible alternatives.
- Act as a contact for you and your carers within the hospital throughout your treatment and care.
- Give you advice on managing symptoms you may have because of your diagnosis.
- Help you identify sources of practical help.
- Liaise with and work collaboratively with other people who may be involved with your care, this may be the hospital doctors, your GP, district nurse, or community Macmillan nurse.
- Offer a sensitive and complete breast prosthesis (artificial shape) fitting service where appropriate.

We are happy to discuss any issues with nominated relatives or carers, but we must gain your permission in advance.

Scarborough

We run a weekly nurse-led clinic at Scarborough Hospital and can arrange for some of your follow up to take place at Scarborough if preferred.
