One Stop Clinic opens

A new Urology One Stop Clinic was officially opened at Malton Community Hospital on 26 January 2017.

The new One Stop Clinic, which was officially opened by The Most Reverend & Right Honourable Dr. John Sentamu, Archbishop of York, is an enhanced service for all urology patients across the region, which allows fast access to diagnosis and treatment.

In contrast to traditional services, patients will only require one appointment and will leave the clinic with a treatment plan.

Hospital shuttle bus trial to end

The hospital shuttle bus service between Scarborough and Bridlington has been withdrawn because not enough passengers are using it.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council stepped in to trial a replacement daily service between the hospitals in Bridlington and Scarborough in July last year, with a number of partners, including the Scarborough and Ryedale Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), agreeing to underwrite any costs.
