 Injury to other abdominal organs requiring further treatment (post cystectomy)
 Palmer- plantar syndrome for patients having MMC
 Passing mucus rectally (post radiotherapy)
 Peripheral neuropathy
 Rectal bleeding (post radiotherapy)
 Tiredness
 Urgency and frequency of urination
 Wound bleeding and bruising (post cystectomy)
 Wound infection (post cystectomy)
