Once in Royal David's City

page 260

Verses 1, 2, 5 and 6 only. Verse 1 solo. Verse 2 choir only – sing with real sensitivity and clarity of diction. Verse 6 descant. Altos – lean heavily into the G on 'lowly' in verse 2. Ensure the final note of each verse is held strongly for a full 2 beats.

Adam Lay Ybounden

Page 32

Men sing verse 1, all ladies verse 2, Sopranos verse 3. Men start verse 4 but ladies join at bar 34. Even though this is in unison, it is not easy, and the intervals need learning carefully (particularly verse 4).

#### Reading

Up! Good Christen folk, and Listen

Page 360

Tricky Bass line needs careful learning. This needs to move at a good tempo, so think and feel it in minims rather than crotchets. Give pause at end of 4th bar. Be ready for the repeat moving from bar 14 to bar 5 – no break in the rhythmic pulse. Sing "tis no fable" softly (as an echo). Repeat the first 4 bars again at the end with a rall. in the last 2 bars.

O Come, All Ye Faithful

Page 226

Verses 1, 2 and 6 only. Verse 6 descant. Sopranos and Altos sing in unison the 1st "O come, let us adore him" in the chorus of each verse. Sopranos – just before the chorus, be precise over the notes on "Angels" "created" etc. (no slithering!)

The Truth from Above

Page 342

Not easy to hold the pitch, so ATB must be confident with the harmonies. Verse 1 Sopranos only. Verse 2 harmony with words. Verse 3 ATB hum, but rehearse verses 4 and 5 thoroughly because of the difficulty of the words not being directly under the notes.

The First Nowell

Page 323

Omit verses 3 and 5. Descant at end of verse 6. Lead the congregation by strong rhythmic singing here.

O Little Town of Bethlehem

Page 234

All 4 verses. Verse 3 choir only: breathe after the 1st "How Silently", but not the 2nd! Also in last line breathe after 'receive him' and WATCH! Verse 4 Unison + descant.

Choir only

Child in a Manger

Page 68

As written, with all ladies singing verse 1 and all men singing verse 2 in unison. Please ensure there are some 2nd sopranos to sing in verse 3. In verse 3 ladies breathe between the 'ah's. Otherwise, breathe every TWO bars (not every bar!) i.e. 4 breaths per verse.

God Rest you Merry, Gentlemen

Page 83

All 5 verses. Verse 1 change words in 2nd line to "was born ON CHRISTMAS day". Always sing refrain in Unison. Verses 1 and 3 in Unison. In verse 5 – Sopranos and Altos be confident with the notes on the "ah"s.

Choir only

Still, Still, Still

Page 306

Sung in English!

As written – All ladies sing verse 1 and men sing verse 2. Verse 3 in harmony. In all 2-note slurs, lean into the first note and shade off the 2nd note.

Away in a Manger

Separate sheet

All sing the words in verses 1 and 3, but ATB sing 'ah' in verse 2. Just a small number of sopranos sing the small notes to the words in verse 3. Observe breathing points carefully, and no breath, but a slight gap to poise the final note of verse 3.

While Shepherds Watched their Flocks

Page 378

Verse 1 Unison, verse 2 and 3 Harmony. Verse 3 choir only. Verse 4 ladies singing the melody. Verse 5 men singing the melody. Verse 6 Unison and descant (in previous years, this has been the least confident descant, so please count carefully and sing with assurance).

#### Reading

Congregational As with Gladness Men of Old Page 52

All verses. Sing verse 1 in unison, verses 2, 3 and 4 in harmony, and take the choir 1 part (the unison tune) for verse 5. Verse 4 choir only - breathe after 'Holy Jesu'.

Choir only Sans Day Carol Page 219

As written. Ladies be particularly careful over notation in Verse 3 "ah" (Sopranos rhythm in bars 73 – 76 is tricky - put an accent on the 1st beat of bar, even though it is tied).

Blessing

Congregational Hark! The Herald-Angels Sing Page 107

All 3 verses. Verses 1 and 2 sing in Harmony (including last 2 bars). Basses – be precise over notes on 3rd line. Verse 3 descant.

## Message from the conductor:

So that you can quickly find the next carol during the service, please write the page number of the NEXT carol at the end of each carol in your book. (You may have to erase the numbers that you wrote in last year!)

Please ensure that these notes are passed on to ALL singers. It is vital that all the carols are learned and confident in advance of the day, that the above directions are carefully observed and copies 'marked up', to achieve a high standard of performance and for all singers to really enjoy the day.
