

Sensory Processing Awareness Training - supporting children with sensory processing difficulties

Overview and aims:

This course will provide an overview of sensory processing and some of the difficulties children with Sensory Processing Disorder (SPD) may present with. It will cover the main senses of the body and how the brain organises the information received from these senses to enable our function as human beings. The course will provide some practical activities to help participants understand the difficulties children and young people can face within their daily activities and practical suggestions to help children within the classroom environment. There will be plenty of opportunity for discussion.
