## **Buckle Fracture of the forearm**

Your child has sustained a minor injury to one of the bones of the forearm. This has been treated with a half plaster cast applied to the back of the hand and forearm.

This sort of fracture is not associated with complications and your child does not need to return to hospital to have the cast removed. After the appropriate time (detailed below), remove the cast yourself by cutting through the bandages on the opposite side of the hard plaster.

Age under three years:	Remove plaster after one week
Age four to six years:	Remove plaster after two weeks
Age six to 10 years:	Remove plaster after three weeks
Age over 10 years:	Remove plaster after three weeks

In the early stages your child may require regular over the counter pain medication, such as paracetamol and Ibuprofen. These can be taken together if required, as instructed and as per dose recommendations on the packet. You should notice their pain beginning to settle as the days go by and the bone heals.

After the cast has been removed your child may still experience some discomfort and stiffness at the wrist for a few days until normal movement returns. If the pain is sufficient to keep your child awake, you should contact our Emergency Department for further advice: York Hospital: 01904 726042, Scarborough Hospital: 01723 385167.
