



Using an Outcomes Registry to Improve Palliative Care Services across Yorkshire

What is it?

As part of the 'RESOLVE' project, the University of Hull have created an Outcomes Registry. This Registry includes all types of palliative care services and is for people diagnosed with all types of illnesses. It collects information based on what you have reported as your main symptoms and concerns.

This information will be used to improve the quality of palliative care that you receive

Is the data collected secure and confidential?

Yes - all information is pseudonymised. At no point will anybody else, other than those who provide your care, be able to see identifiable information.

What if I don't want to take part?

If you prefer not to take part, your data will be excluded from collection for the Outcomes Registry.

If you do not want to take part, then you may opt out of this Registry in one of the following ways:
