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The Multi-Disciplinary Team (MDT)

What is an MDT and what is its function?

It is important that cancer care is planned and monitored by a team of experts. An MDT brings together doctors, nurses and other health professionals who have specialist training and experience in a specific type of cancer. The MDT members meet once a week to review new cancer patients and check the progress of existing patients.

The MDT members work out a treatment plan and will decide if any further tests or investigations are needed. They will make the necessary referrals to specialist services along with collecting patient information and keeping your records up to date.

Who are the MDT Members?

Each member of the MDT has a different role within the team, providing surgical, medical, practical or emotional help and support for you and your family.

Clinical Nurse Specialist (often referred to as a CNS)

A CNS will provide you with the information and support that you may need. The CNS is often referred to as your Key Worker and will be the point of contact between you and the other MDT members.

ENT Surgeon

A specialist cancer surgeon who deals with **E**ar, **N**ose and **T**hroat surgery.

Maxillo-Facial Surgeon

A specialist cancer surgeon who deals with surgery to the mouth, jaw and face.

MDT Co-ordinator

The co-ordinator manages the actual MDT meeting and makes sure that patient information is correct, and all discussions are recorded.

Consultant Clinical Oncologist

A doctor who treats your cancer with radiotherapy or drugs such as chemotherapy.

Consultant Restorative Dentist

A senior dentist that specialises in treating the oral and dental problems caused by cancer and its treatments.

Consultant Pathologist

A doctor that examines body tissues and organs under the microscope.

Consultant Radiologist

A doctor who interprets radiological images such as X-Rays, CT, PET, MRI and ultrasound scans.

Dietitian

A healthcare professional trained to assess the nutritional needs of patients. They can also provide individual dietary advice and support for patients and carers.

Speech and Language Therapist

A healthcare professional that is trained to assess and advise on issues related to speech, voice & swallowing.

What is the MDT Philosophy?

As an MDT we believe that every individual has the right to receive honest information about their disease, to be given appropriate advice and to be allowed to make an informed choice. Whatever their decision may be, they will continue to receive full support and care.

The final decision about treatment is of course down to you. Your Key Worker (usually the Clinical Nurse Specialist) is your point of contact if you have questions.

They can also raise any questions or concerns you have with the other MDT members. All MDT decisions are taken in combination with you and, if you wish, your relatives and carers.

Who are the Specialist Nurses?

The head and neck specialist nurses are registered nurses who have additional specialist training in caring for patients with cancers of the head and neck or thyroid. The specialist nurses are based in the hospital and work as key members of the MDT.

Who is the Service for?

The service is available for anyone who has been diagnosed with head and neck cancer or thyroid cancer and their carers.

How can the Specialist Nurses help?

The specialist nurses are your key contact and can offer;

- Information about your investigations, illness and treatment.
- Support and advice for you, your family and carers.
- Advice on managing any symptoms you may have as a result of your illness.
- Will undertake a Holistic Needs Assessment (HNA) which will help us to understand your individual needs and to create a helpful Care Plan for you.
- Help in identifying sources of practical help for you e.g. financial advice.

- Liaise with other people who may be involved in your care. This may include hospital doctors, your own GP, District Nurse or Macmillan Nurse.
- Information about local and national self-help and support groups to support you and your family.

When and where will I see the Specialist Nurses?

Initially these nurses will see you at one of your clinic visits unless you are admitted to hospital then they will see you on the ward. Following this there will be regular contact throughout your investigations and treatment. These nurses will spend time with you and your family in clinic at the hospital. At any time, you can contact them by telephone to discuss any concerns you may have.

How do I contact the Specialist Nurses?

Your specialist nurses can be contacted between the hours of 8am and 4pm Monday to Friday on 01904 726063.

When the nurses are not in the office, there is a voicemail facility for you to leave a message. If for any reason you are having problems and cannot contact the head and neck nurses please ring your own GP or call the Head & Neck Ward.
