The YTHC had an incredibly busy 2013, funding a number of projects in the hospitals. Please see below some of the projects we funded last year thanks to the generosity of our fantastic supporters:

Cancer Care Centre Courtyard Garden Project



The YTHC raised £20,000 to create a new garden and courtyard area for York Hospital's Cancer Care Centre (CCC). This is now being enjoyed by Cancer patients and their families and friends.

Selby Self Care

Dialysis



We funded £40,000 towards the cost of a new Self Care
Dialysis room at the New Selby War Memorial Hospital to be
used by patients who require life saving renal dialysis.



The mortuary is often an area which is forgotten about so we funded £2,530 to purchase new artwork for Scarborough Hospital's mortuary to create a friendly and warmer environment for visitors.

£20,000 to improve York Hospital's Emergency Department's current resuscitation area. The investment has meant we have been able to increase the current two bedded capacity to three, which will make a huge difference to the 2,200 patients who need resuscitating at York Hospital each year.

Parent Jacilities



Last year, £50,000 was spent to renovate the parent's accommodation on the Special Care Baby Unit (SCBU) at Scarborough Hospital. This work has now been completed and has had a positive impact on family life of those staying on the unit. Families can now be together in a home from home environment whilst their newborn babies receive the best care.



The Macmillan Unit at Scarborough Hospital has undergone a number of changes to improve the chemotherapy area for the benefit of our patients. We have reconfigured the treatment room so we can fit in a further two treatment chairs. This has now resulted in eight chemotherapy treatment areas and we have fitted a more appropriate reception and waiting area. The total cost was £30,036.

The McCain Yorkshire Coast 10k took place on Sunday 3 November and it was a brilliant day. The weather was fantastic, the atmosphere was amazing and it was just a great event. Thanks to everyone who took part.

Over 30 people ran for The Snowdrop Appeal and Scarborough Athletic Club (A.C) has kindly donated £10 for every person who ran for us which is just wonderful. People really got behind us this year and this will make a huge difference to our appeal total. The organisers from Scarborough A.C and McCain chose The Snowdrop Appeal at Scarborough Hospital as its charity for 2013 after its launch in June.

Thorpe Dental Group in York took part in a charity bike ride on Saturday 3 August and raised an incredible £2,272 for SCBU at York Hospital. The team decided to take part in the bike ride in support of SCBU after Principal Dentist with the Practice, Kris Leeson's son, spent a week in SCBU in 2010 with a collapsed lung.

The team participated in a 20 mile bike ride around York over a 3 hour period, collecting donations along the way. The cycle ride started at Woodthorpe Dental Practice and followed a route which included Acaster Malbis, Bishopthorpe and Askham Bryan, before finishing at the Quaker Wood Pub in York.

This year, the Selby Young Farmers annual Summer Dance raised an incredible £1,750 for the Cancer Care Centre at York Hospital.

The Summer Dance took place on Saturday 22 lune at Allotment Farm in Selby. The evening consisted of a summer dance with live band Styckleback, a DI, BBO, bar, cocktails and tombola. Alec Benton

A former patient of York Hospital, Alec Benton, sadly passed away on 1 March 2013.



Cycling from Vietnam to Cambodia

Alec would have turned 80 on 28 November 2013 so in memory of his special Birthday his widow, Pauline, has generously donated £8,080 to York Hospital to be used for equipment to prolong and save other people's lives. This includes a non-invasive ventilator and a vital signs monitor for the respiratory department, two Doppler Ultrasound machines which measures blood flow through the blood vessels for podiatry and the vascular team and an automated defibrillator for the resuscitation team.

Alec had suffered over many years with Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD) and arthritis. Five years ago he had a massive heart attack followed by a stroke and pneumonia. During the subsequent years Alec had a number of health problems which included losing the use of his right hand, suffering a minor heart attack, a cataract operation, loss of sight in one of his eyes and stents fitted to improve circulation problems in his legs. With continuing bad circulation he attended the podiatry clinic and in early 2013, he had to have a second femoral bypass procedure to unblock arteries in his legs.

Unfortunately after discharge from hospital Alec was readmitted a few days later with breathing problems which turned out to be pneumonia and he passed away within hours on 1 March 2013. We are all very sorry for Pauline's loss as Alec was so well thought of amongst staff at the hospital and we cannot thank Pauline enough for her incredibly generous donation.

This breathtaking charity bike ride is one of the best in the world of fundraising events and takes participants from Vietnam's Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon) to the ancient temples of Angkor Wat in Cambodia. This follows a 400km charity cycle route which passes through many traditional Vietnamese villages.



When Seth Hornby was born 3 months prematurely on 27 December 2012, his family was unsure what the New Year held for them. Seth was born at Scarborough Hospital and transferred to York to the Neo-natal Unit straight away. At 20 days old on 16 January 2013, Seth had gained strength and was doing well, so he was transferred back to Scarborough's SCBU.

Each of his days were recorded in his memory book which is created by the nurses and staff and filled with pictures, items from experiences and lots of colourful writing. The memory books are a way for parents to see their baby's activities whilst they were not there, but more importantly a story for Seth to have when he is older.

Seth's parents, Rachel and Shaun, decided they wanted to thank SCBU for the care and support they received and organised several events in their home town of Pickering to raise funds. After 5 months of fundraising, Rachel, Shaun and the Boon Hill Show Committee presented the staff of SCBU with £5,000.

Whilst Seth was in SCBU, the YTHC was raising money to improve the parent facilities on the unit. Having experienced the old facilities, Rachel and Shaun wanted to make a difference to the lives of future families who would use SCBU, so we are very grateful to their efforts and generous donation. Their donation will also support the ongoing work of the memory books that are created for babies who stay on SCBU for a period of time.



Roy Heath's sponsored cycle ride

£2,500 raised for York Hospital's Cancer Care Centre garden

Mr Roy Heath had a stroke in July 2010 and the stroke affected his speech badly. Mr Heath said the care he received during his stay on the Stroke/ Stroke Rehabilitation Wards at York Hospital were 'first class'.

Following his discharge home, the speech therapy department continued to give weekly visits at home and successfully helped Roy to communicate again and speak to be understood.

Roy decided he would like to thank the hospital by raising some money for the stroke departments so he decided to take part in a sponsored cycle ride from Selby to York Knavesmire and back again, totalling 34 miles. Roy did the cycle ride with his 20 year old Grandson and raised a fantastic £392.50

Roy's family are all very proud of him and he is so pleased to have done this for the unit.

York band Generation Groove has raised an incredible £2,500 for the Cancer Care Centre Garden at York Hospital from the proceeds of their Last Night of the Proms concert in October. The concert took place at the York Citadel which was kindly donated by the Salvation Army.

Generation Groove was formed in 2002 and now has 35 members playing brass and wind instruments. The band is now in its 11th year and rehearses at Haxby Memorial Hall every Thursday. As a community band, Generation Groove looks to help a local cause at least once a year and the idea for this event was suggested by one of the band clarinetists, Dawn Hine, who works in the Breast Imaging Unit at York Hospital.

Diane Beal, Musical Director of Generation Groove said, "I was particularly keen to raise money for the Cancer Care Centre as I was diagnosed with endometrial cancer in 2007 and the care and support I received was amazing. As a band we have always enjoyed the Last Night of the Proms concerts and the opportunity to perform for such a good cause was too good to miss. We were pleased to be able to include the choir from Joseph Rowntree School and two of their soloists Eleanor Leaper and Oliver Dowker also took part."



Skydive raises £1,200 for York Hospital's Head and Neck Department

In August, 67 year old Linda Dodgson took part in a sponsored skydive in Bridlington and raised over £1,200 for the Head and Neck Department at York Hospital.

Linda took part in the skydive with her 23 year old grandson Tom Keeping after they were both diagnosed with Cancer in 2012. Linda was diagnosed with mouth cancer and had radical surgery in December 2012 at York Hospital to treat this.

Linda said, "I wanted to undertake a challenge to raise funds for the Head and Neck Department as a way of saying thank you for the fantastic care I received. Everyone looked after me so well. I thoroughly enjoyed the skydive, especially doing it with my grandson, and I'd like to thank my family and friends for their support and sponsorship."
