


Accessing NHS Electronic Journals

NHS staff can access nearly 3,000 electronic journals from any computer connected to the internet, using your NHS OpenAthens password.

NICE Evidence provides a complete A-Z listing of all the journals you can access, both in print (from York or Scarborough Hospital Library) and electronically.

This guide assumes that you already have a reference to a journal article, and you want to find out if it's available electronically or in print.

- Go to www.evidence.nhs.uk and then click **Journals and Databases**
- Click on the **Journals** link. You will then need to login with your NHS OpenAthens username and password using the **login with OpenAthens** link in the yellow box. It is important to login at this stage or you will not see our own local e-journal holdings. You can self-register for an NHS OpenAthens account from any Trust computer by clicking on the **Register for an OpenAthens account here** link.
- On **Search My Journals**, enter the title of the journal required and click **search**.

If the journal is available you will see a page like this:

- If it is available **online**, it will say “Available from” with a link to the provider’s website, e.g. [MEDLINE with Full Text](#).
- **Tip!** If you are not taken to the journal homepage, you may need to enter your OpenAthens details again. Look out for an OpenAthens login link on-screen and click on the link to re-authenticate.

- If it is available in print it will state that it is “Available in print..” in York or Scarborough Hospital Library,

Check whether the particular volume is available by looking at the dates next to the “Full Text” heading to the right. Please note that some publishers embargo recent issues.

Opening an article

On the journal’s homepage, locate the relevant year (this may be listed under an “Archive” tab). Select the correct issue, and click on the required article.

Depending upon the source you may have different options to view articles in PDF and/or HTML (see example below). Either option will open the full-text article. Note: You will need Adobe Reader to open PDF files.
